Parent and Family Engagement Policy

- 8. The <u>Tiospaye Topa School</u> will notify parents that they may request and the school will provide certain information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's teachers and paraprofessionals, as appropriate.
 - Letter mailed home
- 9. The <u>Tiospaye Topa School</u> will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --
 - the state's academic content standards,
 - the state's student academic achievement standards,
 - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - the requirements of Part A,
 - how to monitor their child's progress, and
 - how to work with educators

The <u>Tiospaye Topa School</u> will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

- 11. The <u>Tiospaye Topa School</u> will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
 - Effective Home School Partnerships and Family Engagement training for staff
 - Encourage staff to engage in parent involvement events and parent activities
